DSC Joins National Alliance for Direct Support Professionals



DSC recently became a member of the National Alliance for Direct Support Professionals (NADSP), thanks to funding from the Champaign County Developmental Disabilities Board through a Workforce Retention Grant. We chose to join this strong alliance, because everything we do each day, regardless of one's role at DSC, revolves around the people receiving services from us, directly and indirectly. As a member of NADSP, we're also

showing a commitment to those who make a world of difference in people's lives. This means that DSPs will have exclusive access to resources, educational webinars, discounts, and more, to help support them in their important work.

The vision of NADSP is a world with a highly qualified and professional direct support workforce that partners with, supports, and empowers people with disabilities to lead a life of their choosing. NADSP works to elevate the status of direct support professionals by improving practice standards, promoting system reform, and advancing their knowledge, skills and values, through certification, credentialing, training, professional development, and accreditation services.

NADSP shares nine tenets, which guide all Direct Support Professionals (DSPs):

- (1) PERSON-CENTERED SUPPORTS As a DSP, my first allegiance is to the person I support; all other activities and functions I perform flow from this allegiance.
- (2) PROMOTING PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING As a DSP, I will commit to promote the emotional, physical, and personal well-being of the people I support. I will encourage growth and recognize the autonomy of those receiving support while being attentive and energetic in reducing the risk of harm.
- (3) INTEGRITY AND RESPONSIBILITY As a DSP, I will support the mission and vitality of my profession to assist people in leading self-directed lives, and to foster a spirit of partnership with the people I support, other professionals, and the community.
- (4) CONFIDENTIALITY As a DSP, I will safeguard and respect the confidentiality and privacy of the people I support.
- (5) JUSTICE, FAIRNESS, and EQUITY As a DSP, I will affirm the human rights, as well as the civil rights and responsibilities of the people I support. I will promote and practice justice, fairness, and equity for the people I support and the community as a whole.
- (6) RESPECT As a DSP, I will respect the human dignity and uniqueness of the people I support. I will recognize each person who I support as valuable and promote their value to our communities.
- (7) RELATIONSHIPS As a DSP, I will assist the people I support to develop and maintain relationships.
- (8) SELF-DETERMINATION As a DSP, I will assist the people I support to direct the course of their own lives.
- (9) ADVOCACY As a DSP, I will advocate for the people I support for justice, inclusion, and full community participation.

Continuous learning and knowledge building are added benefits to being a member of NADSP. Through NADSP's E-Badge Academy, DSPs and Frontline Supervisors (FLSs) can earn national certification through stackable electronic badges. These badges demonstrate the knowledge, skills, and values that these professionals utilize every day, recognizing the professional development that might otherwise go unacknowledged.

DSC is proud to be a member of the National Alliance of Direct Support Professionals, and we look forward to utilizing our membership to continue to give the best support to our employees and those receiving services from us.
